

On average 2 students in every class of 30 have a neurodevelopmental condition called Developmental Language Disorder or DLD. Friday 18th of October 2024 is DLD Awareness Day and so we're calling on settings across Bradford to #speakupforDLD.

DLD Awareness Day is celebrated internationally each year. It's a day for families, therapists, schools and the community to come together and support each other. The event aims to raise awareness and understanding in the community about Developmental Language Disorders. Purple and Yellow are the official colours for DLD Awareness Day.

PRESOURCE OF THE TERM

Autism, Identity and Me: A Practical Workbook and Professional Guide to Empower Autistic Children and Young People Aged 10+. The programme was developed by Rebecca Duffus, an Advisory Teacher with a special interest in autism. It was developed in collaboration with autistic individuals.

The resource (a workbook and a guidebook) is based on the evidence that children and young people who have a positive understanding of their autistic identity have higher self-esteem and wellbeing as adults. It uses a social model interpretation of autism to help children and young people to understand their diagnosis. We advise that this resource is used sensitively, by someone who knows the student well and that parents are aware and happy for their child to work with school on this programme. She carries out lots of interventions independently and knows when to move children on to the next stage and when to speak to me for the next step. Often, I just need to give her a target and she will already have the resources and be able to get started straight away. Andrea carries out the Wellcomm screening and interventions independently. She makes excellent observations of the children, often giving me a heads up about which children might need more specific support.
