Personal Development

Our whole school assembly themes this half term are our Root of Learning "Daring to be Different" and the British Value of Tolerance.

PSHE

Our first unit of work in PSHE will be based on the topic 'Being me in my world'. The children will be learning to recognise the importance of self-worth, how to face challenges and how our actions and choices can have an impact on others. They will be focussing on working collaboratively, encouraging others and developing an understanding of team work and negotiation.

PΕ

Football

This unit will focus on exploring and applying the principles of attack and defence leading to keeping possession and playing a modified game

Gymnastics

This unit will focus on exploring movements and balances using symmetrical shapes. Pupils will perform a sequence that includes holding a symmetrical balance on apparatus, travelling to a new piece of apparatus, and finishing with an asymmetrical balance.

Our World

History

Through our history topic, children will learn about how the Stone Age to Bronze Age period impacted on life in Britain. The children will learn about the first traces of human settlements and how archaeologists' piece together what happened during this period from the artefacts and materials they left behind. Through our outdoor learning sessions, we will pay close attention to shelter, tools and diet during the Neolithic period and how this has developed over time.



RE

This term, the children will be learning how Jewish people use stories to remember God's covenant. They will study key Jewish stories, considering their significance. The children will explore how Jewish faith is expressed through rituals and actions, and reflect on how these practices demonstrate a sense of belonging within the Jewish community.

STEM

Science

The children will become expert 'Rock Stars' as they explore the different types of rock, how they are formed and where they are found. We will also be exploring soil, looking at the importance of soil and learning how to make compost in our outdoor learning sessions.



Maths

This half term, the children will begin working with numbers to 1000. They will be able to partition, order and compare 3-digit numbers. We will then move onto addition and subtraction. This will include mental recall of common addition facts and they will be taught the formal written methods for addition and subtraction of three-digit numbers.

Computing

This half term, the children will learn to use 2Email for electronic communication. They will practice composing, replying to emails and managing attachments. Importantly, they will explore key safety aspects to ensure responsible and secure use of email.


Language and Communication

Speaking

Throughout all subjects, we will refine our cognitive, physical, linguistic and social and emotional speaking skills. This will be done through debates and the performance of different poems.

Writing

Our focussed text for this half term is 'Stone Age Boy'. The children will be using the story as inspiration to write their own diaries from the point of view of the characters in



the story. They will focus on ambitious descriptions and refining vocabulary.

Reading

The children will be reading a range of different texts including; fiction, non-fiction and poetry. They will be covering the following skills: Vocabulary, Inference, Predict, Explain, Retrieval and Summarise.

Spelling

During our spelling lessons, we will focus on new rules. These are listed below. Children will learn, apply and practise these rules. In addition, we will be focusing on Autumn 1 CEW.

Spanish:

In Key Stage 2, the children get the exciting opportunity to begin learning Spanish! Our first objectives will be learning common greetings, classroom instructions and numbers 1-20.

The Arts

Art

This half term, we will explore 3D sculptures by studying Neolithic clay pots. Pupils will learn about early pottery techniques, examine the significance of these historical artefacts and create their own clay pots using coiling and shaping methods inspired by Neolithic designs.



3P Music

All the learning this half term will be focused around the theme of 'India'. Children will be learning a range of traditional songs and using a variety of instruments to accompany them.

3S Recorders

Common Exception Words (CEW)

Each half term, the children will be focusing on a different set of common exceptions words. These will be built into the weekly spelling tests. Remember to look back at the Year 2 words to ensure you can spell all these words too.
